

## **Dr. Guénaël R. Rodier**

Dr Rodier is Director, Division of Communicable Diseases, Health Security and Environment, WHO Regional Office for Europe, Copenhagen, Denmark. Prior to his present position, he worked at the World Health Organization (WHO), Geneva, Switzerland as Director, International Health Regulations Coordination, and since 2000, as Director, Department of Communicable Disease Surveillance and Response. His work experience includes service with the International Health Program, University of Maryland, Baltimore, and as an infectious disease epidemiologist with the United States Naval Medical Research Unit 3, in Cairo, Egypt. Dr Rodier, who started his career as a clinician in east Africa, possesses disease-specific experience in viral haemorrhagic fevers (Ebola, Marburg and Rift Valley fevers), HIV/AIDS, cholera, dengue, hantavirus infection, severe acute respiratory syndrome (SARS), influenza and many other diseases. He has been actively involved in the development of new WHO strategies and tools for communicable disease surveillance and response, including the design and supervision of the 2005 revision of the International Health Regulations. Dr Rodier has led and managed medical teams in private practice, the United States Navy, and WHO; and has coordinated international field teams conducting research projects, outbreak investigations, and assessments of national surveillance systems in many countries, on all continents. Dr Rodier holds an MD from Paris University and an MSc in clinical tropical medicine from the London School of Hygiene & Tropical Medicine. He has authored or co-authored over 80 publications and book chapters.
